The 2024 legislative session saw historic progress for Colorado's environment!

Together we secured nationally-leading policies on climate, air, lands, water and healthier communities, while also stopping an attempt by the oil and gas industry to roll back a decade's worth of climate progress through more than a dozen dangerous ballot initiatives.

Our Collective Wins

CLIMATE & CLEAN AIR

- Secured protections to address air pollution caused by the oil and gas industry
- Tackled the largest source of climate pollution - transportation - and the housing affordability crisis with landmark policies and funding to support transit, combat sprawl, promote housing affordability and reduce pollution

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

- Expanded environmental justice programs and protections against the toxic impacts of cumulative pollution
- Prioritized cleaning up abandoned oil and gas wells in communities most impacted by pollution

WATER QUALITY & PUBLIC LANDS

- Became the first state in the nation to pass legislation to protect our wetlands and streams - more than 60% of Colorado's waters - after Trump's Supreme Court revoked clean water protections that had been in place for five decades
- Passed legislation securing one of the largest investments in Colorado's parks and wildlife in over a decade
