Across every issue area where we work, our legislative leaders took action. The bills they passed this year include:



Healthy Communities & Justice

- 1. <u>HB22-1244</u> requires monitoring air toxics, develops health-based standards, and requires companies to use technology to cut pollution to protect communities' health.
- 2. <u>SB22-150</u> creates a state office of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives.
- **3.** <u>HB22-1322</u> requires state regulators to communicate with disproportionately impacted communities and holds polluters accountable.
- HB22-1394 assists communities moving away from coal-based economies through Colorado's Office of Just Transition.



Lands & Water

- 1. <u>HB22-1345</u> prohibits the sale or distribution of certain products that contain intentionally added "forever" chemicals.
- 2. <u>HB22-1358</u> takes steps to eliminate lead in the drinking water of facilities where children are present.
- **3.** <u>HB22-1151</u> incentivizes water-wise landscapes and creates a state program to finance the voluntary replacement of irrigated turf.
- SB22-151 provides funding for projects that ensure safe road crossings for wildlife and helps reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions.
- **5.** <u>HB22-1361</u> enhances oversight of oil and gas operations within the state.
- **5B22-206** supports disaster preparedness and recovery by creating a disaster resilience rebuilding program, a sustainable rebuilding program, and an office of climate preparedness.



Climate & Clean Energy

- 1. <u>SB22-193</u> invests in air quality improvements, including electric school buses and e-bikes to help reduce pollution and clean up our air.
- 2. <u>SB22-180</u> creates an ozone season transit grant program to provide free transit services for at least 30 days during ozone season.
- 3. <u>HB22-1362</u> reduces building greenhouse gas emissions by improving building codes, creating building electrification and high-efficiency electric heating and appliances grant programs, and by establishing a clean air building investments fund.
- 4. <u>HB22-1355</u> ensures that the companies that produce recyclable materials fully fund and manage a program to ensure those materials are recycled.



You Make Our Victories Possible!

In 2022, Conservation Colorado members sent over 7,500 emails and made over 2,000 calls to legislators. Over 300 members met with legislators in person during hearings, meetings, and at events like Latino/a Advocacy Day and our first-ever Conservation Colorado member lobby day. Activists helped us make clear how important climate, conservation, and environmental justice are to Coloradans. Your advocacy helped us pass:

- Concrete steps towards cleaning up our air
- Wise investments in clean air and conservation
- Action to help hit our climate targets
- Bold policies to cut toxics from our air and water
- Wins with our partners to advance environmental, racial, and economic justice

This year's legislative session came down to the wire. Your support and advocacy broke through the noise and passed another suite of bills to move our state in the right direction.
